Jorge N. Ferrer, PhD, is core faculty at the California Institute of Integral Studies, San Francisco, and adjunct faculty at the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology, Palo Alto, California. He is the author of *ReVisioning Transpersonal Theory: A Participatory Vision of Human Spirituality* and editor of a monograph of the journal *ReVision on New Horizons in Contemporary Spirituality*. Dr. Ferrer received his Ph.D. from the California Institute of Integral Studies and serves as an associate professor and core faculty in the East-West Psychology program. He has also a degree of Lic. Psicologia Clinica (1991) from the University of Barcelona (Spain). Formerly a fellow of "La Caixa" Foundation, a research fellow of the Catalonian Council, and an ERASMUS scholar at the University of Wales (United Kingdom), he also teaches as adjunct faculty at the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology, Palo Alto, California.

Dr. Ferrer is the author of *ReVisioning Transpersonal Theory: A Participatory Vision of Human Spirituality*; several articles, translations, and book-chapters on transpersonal studies; and editor of a monographic issue of *ReVision: The Journal of Consciousness and Transformation on "New Horizons in Contemporary Spirituality."* He currently serves on the editorial board of *The Journal of Transpersonal Psychology* and *ReVision*. Currently a leading scholar on Transformative Practices at the Esalen Center for Theory and Research, Big Sur, California, and a member of The Forge Guild of Trans-Traditional Spiritual Leaders and Teachers, he has also served as member of the Planning Committee of the Buddhist Peace Fellowship's BASE (Buddhist Alliance for Social Engagement), and offered supportive counseling to marginalized Latino women at the center Arriba Juntos in the Mission district of San Francisco.

Dr. Ferrer teaches courses on transpersonal psychology, embodied spiritual inquiry, comparative mysticism, integral development, philosophy of science, socially engaged spirituality, and spiritual perspectives on sexuality and relationships, as well as co-facilitates workshops and intensive retreats on Holistic Sexuality/Holistic Integration at CIIS, the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology, and Esalen Institute.

In 2000, Dr. Ferrer received the Presidential Award from the Fetzer Institute, Kalamazoo (Michigan) for his seminal work on consciousness studies and, since 2003, he is advisor to the Salamander Fund for the Advanced Study of Consciousness.
